

LYNDON CITY COUNCIL
SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES OF
July 1, 2019

The Lyndon City Council met in special session on Monday, July 1, 2019, 6:00 p.m., at City Hall.

1. CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Morrison called the meeting to order.

a) ROLL CALL: City Clerk called roll of the City Council. Mayor Morrison and members Doug Harty, Kevin Heit, Darin Schmitt and Katie Shepard present. Patterson absent with notification.

City Staff present: Pat Walsh, City Attorney; Julie Stutzman, City Clerk; Darrel Manning, Chief of Police; and Scott Culley, Public Works.

2. APPROVAL OF SPECIAL AGENDA: Schmitt made the motion to approve the special agenda for discussion of the Jackson Street Improvement Project. Shepard seconded; motion carried.

3. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

a) JACKSON STREET SEWER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PRESENTATION, BG CONSULTANTS: Mayor Morrison stated that the residents were invited to attend in order to discuss a project opportunity which would be included in the current sewer project and funded through unused grant funding. Mr. Foster and Mr. Weishaar proceeded with a PowerPoint presentation as well as a map on the proposed project for the residents who will be affected on 6th Street as well as residents on the east side of Jackson St. It was noted that the proposed project design is pre-liminary and that the purpose of this meeting is to gather information and to provide residents information.

Currently, the residents on the east side of Jackson Street are responsible for approximately 750 to 800 feet of sewer line that runs to the city main. The proposed project would alleviate that issue and reduce the amount of sewer line the residents would be responsible for and provide a better system.

During the meeting, each resident shared information on their current sewer system set up to the engineer, asked questions on how this affects their homes, easement discussions, and voiced any concerns they had. Mrs. Schmitz stated that she would like to make sure that she is notified when work is to be done on her property and it was noted they would be.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS: None.

5. ADJOURNMENT: At 6:45 p.m. Schmitt made the motion to adjourn the special meeting. Shepard seconded; motion carried.
